Almost three years ago, NITI Aayog had reported that 600 million people are suffering from extreme water stress, across the country. I presume the numbers must have certainly increased substantially. If those facts are not alarming, it was also reported that India is placed at the 120th position, amongst 122 countries, in the water quality index, for the simple reason that nearly 70% of fresh water sources have been contaminated and about 200,000 people were dying every year, due to inadequate access to safe water.

Many cities, in India, are finding it hard to manage their water supply, primarily because they are suffering due to acute water scarcity and require “immediate action”. It also needs to be remembered that growing stress on water will also hit India’s food security. There are studies which state that come 2030, over 40% of India’s population will have no access to drinking water. India holds about 4% of global freshwater for almost 18% of the world population and is the largest user of groundwater sources. The Earth needs fresh water to feed people’s needs, preserve ecological balance, help all species to survive and maintain the synergy of nature.
